Editorial Standards

The <u>Economics Bulletin</u> is an open access, peer-reviewed, letters journal that publishes Notes, Comments and Preliminary Results in all area of economics. Submissions are restricted to seven printed pages exclusive of references, appendices, tables and figures.

One of our central missions is to foster free and extremely rapid scientific communication across the entire community of research economists As such, we make every attempt to make decisions within six to eight weeks and accepted paper are published immediately. Thus, we would appreciate it if you could provide your review within 30 days. In hopes of making this more feasible, we ask only that you make an up or down recommendation and provide a short paragraph or two explaining the reasons for your recommendation. Our standard for publication is that papers be **original**, **correct**, **and of interest to a specialist in the field**.

Mechanics

To accept an invitation review a paper, click on the link provided in email that requested your help, then click on the "Accept/Decline invitation" link. You will be given an interface that allows you to accept, decline or propose a new deadline to provide a report. If you find you must decline, we would be very grateful if you could suggest alternative reviewers.

When you are ready to submit your report, click on the same link provided in the invitation email, but click on the "Upload report" link. You can either upload your report as a PDF file or type or cut and paste it directly into the editing box provided in the interface. You may also write a cover letter to the editor in charge of the manuscript with your candid comments and advice. This will not be forwarded to the authors.

If you lose your invitation email, <u>click here</u> You will be asked to supply the paper number, your user name (email address) and password. If you have forgotten your password, you can request it at the login screen. It is important that you use the same email address the associate editor used to contact you. Otherwise, the system will not recognize you.
