The 2001 University of Warwick Department of Economics Euro-Workshop on Public Economics will be held at the University of Warwick from July 9th to July 20st. This year the overall title of the event will be New Economies, New Technologies and Public Economics The first week of the workshop, organized by Myrna Wooders, will focus on theory, especially networks and coalition formation. The second week, organized by Jonathan Cave and Carlo Perroni, will focus on public policy in the new economies. Beginning with a reception on the evening of July 9th, a larger conference will be held over the weekend. The Warwick Department of Economics Workshops have been held every summer for more than twenty years. This year, as in the past, the workshops will have a light seminar schedule, allowing time for individuals to pursue discussions of topics of common interest and to start new collaborations and continue established ones. There will also be a number of social events, including a trip to a Shakespearean production in Stratford-on-Avon. We anticipate approximately forty participants for each week of the workshop. Typically workshop participants stay all or most of at least one week of the workshop. The light seminar schedule of the workshop means that not all workshop participants will be able to give seminars during the workshop. The weekend conference, however, will provide participants further opportunities to present their own works. The conference will consist of both plenary and contributed sessions. Following the pattern of prior Association for Public Economic Theory (APET) conferences, there will be parallel sessions.
