Today, risk is everywhere in our society. It has harmful effects on peoples' quality of live and on the competitiveness of business thus hindering the economic growth and social development as shown by financial crises, bankruptcy, natural disasters, pollution, health crises, etc. Risk management has therefore become a major issue in identifying, measuring and regulating risks to reduce their effects. The aim of this workshop is to provide general insight, both economic and financial, into risk management by means of specific approaches from microeconomics, macroeconomics, finance, actuarial science, statistics, econometrics. The variety of disciplines, bringing together different skills and backgrounds, should allow to promote and enrich the debate on risk management and provide new solutions to improve it. We invite both theoretical and empirical papers on one of the following topics (non-exhaustive list): Financial Risks (financial crisis and systemic risk; international financial regulation; alternative investments; risk modeling and risk measures; market volatility and behavioural finance), Bank Risks (banking profitability and prudential supervision; bank loan supply, capital structure and risks; bank governance and incentives mechanisms; contagion and risk management; banking intermediation and asymmetric information), Industrial, environmental and geopolitical risks (insurability; major risk management: incentives mechanisms, risk prevention and interactions between actors (public sector, firms, individuals); reinsurance; legal risks), Health and Ageing (health insurance systems; health market regulation: rationalization, incentives mechanisms and asymmetric information; retirement, saving and life cycle; life insurance; dependency risk), Risk and Regulation (insurance litigation, strategic behaviour between actors (insurer, insured, judge...), prevention and compensation).
